## Course Description

Computer Graphic Arts explores the drawing and design principles, tools and techniques used in graphic design. The historical, social and cultural analyses of art and design are explored and analyzed. Emphases are placed upon the practical aspects of commercial art (graphic design and art direction) and how

this art is used in publishing, design and illustration, photography, multimedia and Internet web presentations. Technology and computers are used as design tools. The course will primarily focus on the industry standard Adobe Creative Suite applications.

A systematic and structured approach is used to complete a wide range of projects of increasing difficulty in various types of media starting with Adobe Illustrator. Students will keep design blogs, critique their work and the work of others while maintaining a digital portfolio of their work.

- 1. Create and edit line art in Illustrator.
- Developing creative ideas into finished products.
- Have the ability to complete layout and design in Photoshop and Illustrator (photo manipulation is done in Digital Photo).
- 4. Have a solid understanding of the basic elements of art & principles of design, color theory, and typographic standards (with kerning, leading, & tracking).
- 5. Understand and use creative problem solving processes to improve their work.
- 6. Understand basics and differences for web publishing and print production.
- 7. Have the ability to critique and turn criticism into a better final product.
- 8. Generate an online portfolio and blog for digital journaling.
- 9. Students will gain experience and confidence in presenting themselves as professionals in the workplace.
