
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## **COLOR TERMINOLOGY**

**Primary Colors:** Colors at their basic essence; those colors that cannot be created by mixing others - *Red, Yellow, Blue.* 

**Secondary Colors:** Those colors achieved by a mixture of two primaries- *Orange, Violet, Green*.

**Tertiary Colors:** Those colors achieved by a mixture of primary and secondary hues - *Red Orange*, *Red Violet*, *Yellow Orange*, *Yellow Green*, *Blue Green*, *Blue Violet*.

Color Theory:
Monochromatic: Using variations of one color.
Analogous Colors: Those colors located close together on a color wheel. Complimentary
Complementary Colors: Those colors located opposite each other on a color wheel
(Primary + Secondary or Tertiary + Tertiary) - Red - Green, Yellow - Violet, Blue - Orange.
Split Complementary: A variation of the complementary color scheme where one color
in the complimentary color scheme is replaced the two colors adjacent to it.
Triadic: Uses three colors that are evenly spaced around the color wheel.
<b>Tetradic:</b> Uses 4 colors evenly spaced around the color wheel.
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To vary your scheme try using shades, tints and tones as well as desaturating colors for creative and interesting variations.
