## COLOR TERMINOLOGY

Primary Colors: Colors at their basic essence; those colors that cannot be created by mixing others Red, Yellow, Blue.

Secondary Colors: Those colors achieved by a mixture of two primaries- Orange, Violet, Green.
Tertiary Colors: Those colors achieved by a mixture of primary and secondary hues - Red Orange, Red Violet, Yellow Orange, Yellow Green, Blue Green, Blue Violet.

## Color Theory:

Monochromatic: Using variations of one color.


Analogous Colors: Those colors located close together on a color wheel.Complimentary


Complementary Colors: Those colors located opposite each other on a color wheel (Primary + Secondary or Tertiary + Tertiary) - Red - Green, Yellow - Violet, Blue - Orange.


Split Complementary: A variation of the complementary color scheme where one color in the complimentary color scheme is replaced the the two colors adjacent to it.


Triadic: Uses three colors that are evenly spaced around the color wheel.


Tetradic: Uses 4 colors evenly spaced around the color wheel.


To vary your scheme try using shades, tints and tones as well as desaturating colors for creative and interesting variations.
